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Nashville Veteran participates in National Disabled Sports Clinic

NASHVILLE, Tenn. -- Charles “Chuck” Baldinger, a local Veteran with [an incredible story](#), is participating in the 32nd National Disabled Winter Sports Clinic, April 1 to 6 in Aspen-Snowmass, Colo.

Baldinger is taking part in rock climbing, SCUBA diving and skiing alongside his fellow disabled Veterans, volunteers and coaches.

For more than three decades, the National Disabled Veterans Winter Sports Clinic has helped many of our nation’s most profoundly disabled Veterans overcome obstacles and challenge their perceived limitations.

The five-day event offers Nordic and downhill skiing, sled hockey, rock climbing, scuba diving and paddling in addition to adaptive sports workshops, educational classes and other activities. It is the largest rehabilitative event of its kind in the world and hosted more than 400 participants this year.

The Winter Sports Clinic is sponsored by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and Disabled American Veterans (DAV), with financial assistance from corporate sponsors and individual donors.
